

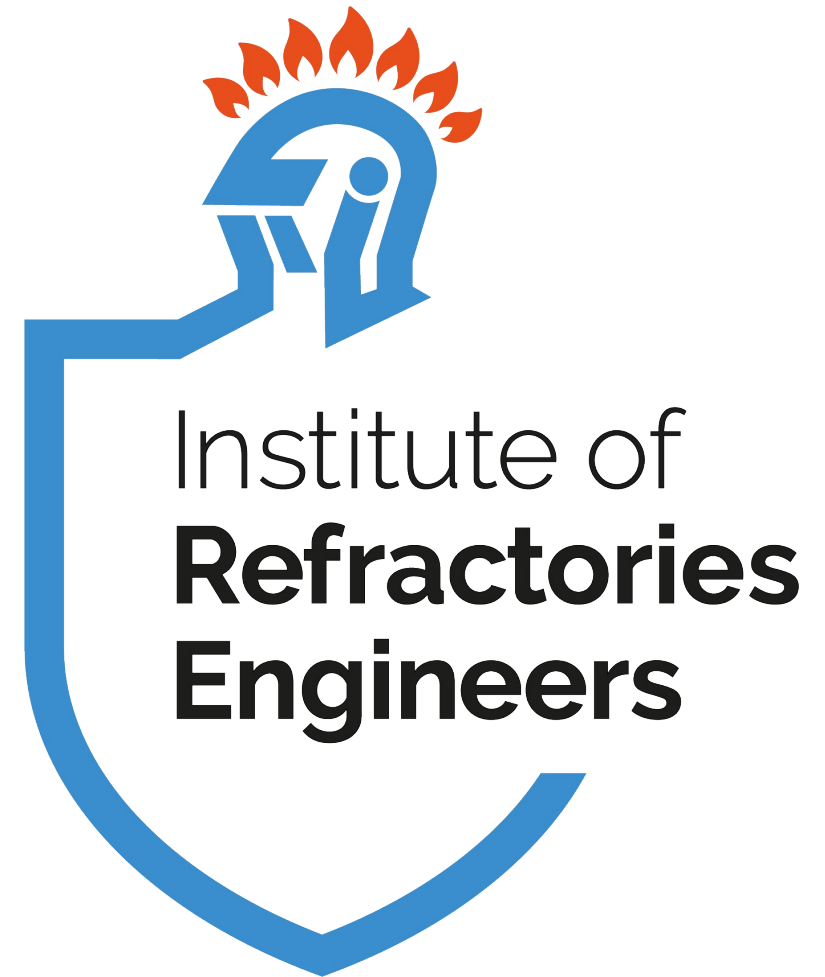

Current Status of the Institute of Refractories Engineers

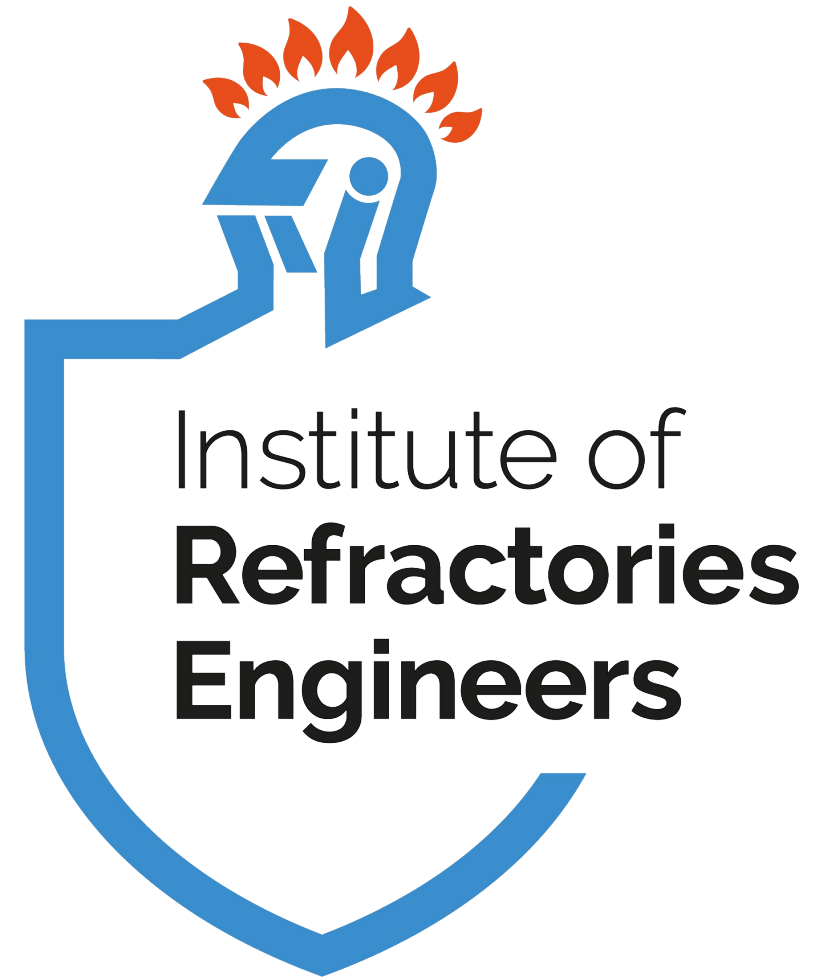
-Membership is growing steadily as can be seen in the membership figures for the last few years:

The Council

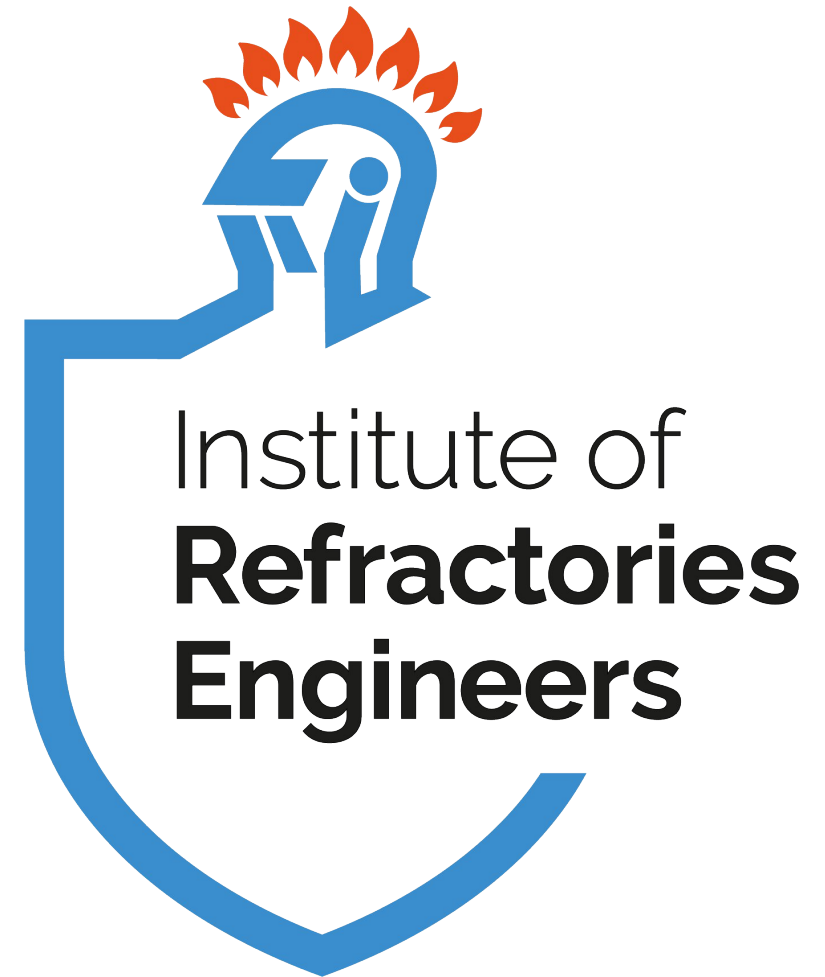
The council currently comprises of **16 members**.

Australia Branch

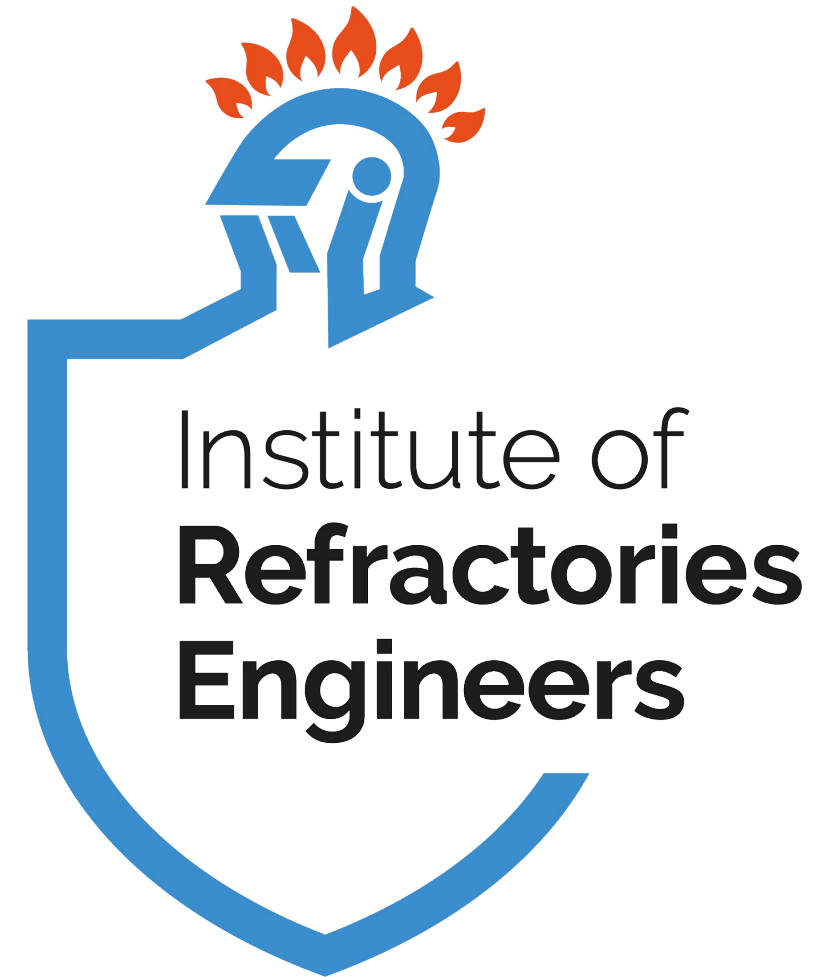
Australia continues to be a forward thinking and growing branch

Fundamental Objectives of the IRE

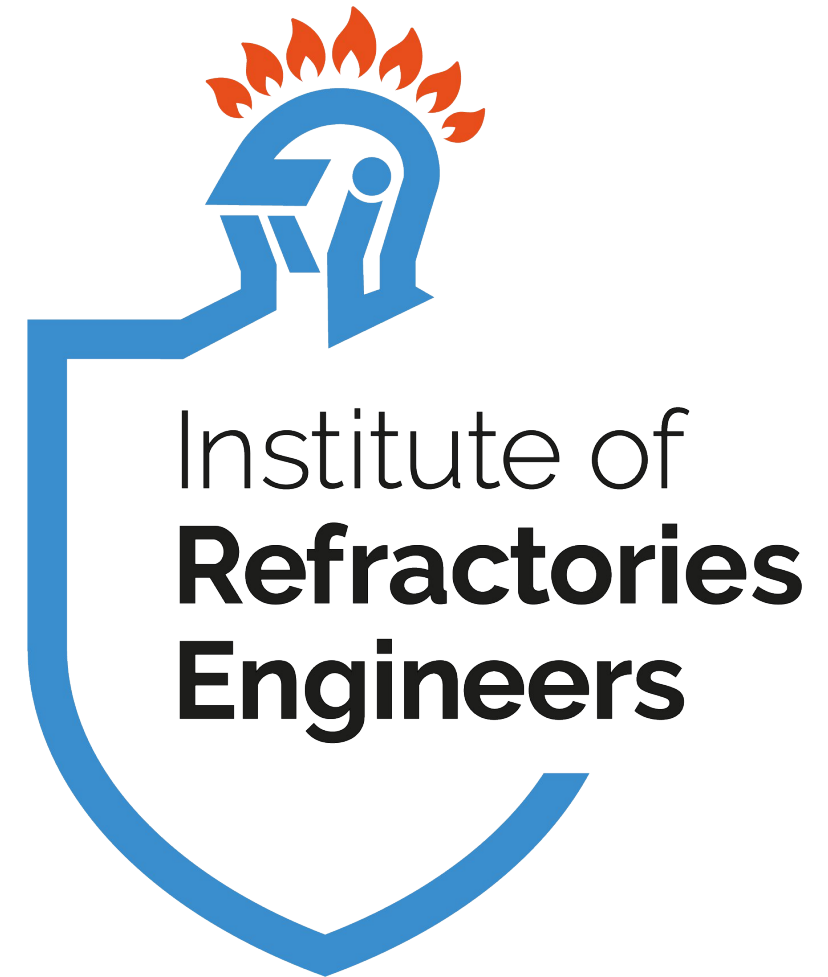
Raising standards and training in our field of science and technology.

This year's conference is currently in planning and will feature some collaboration with Ceramics UK and a new section; 'Best Paper' competition for young people coming into the industry.



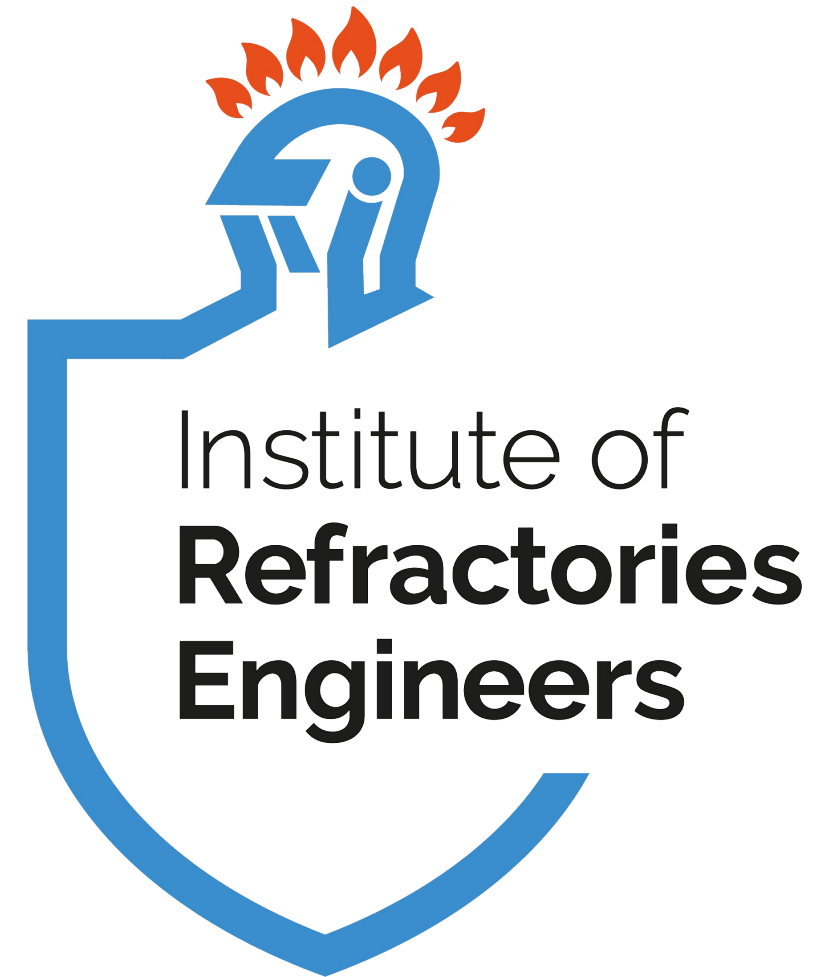
Fundamental Objectives cont.

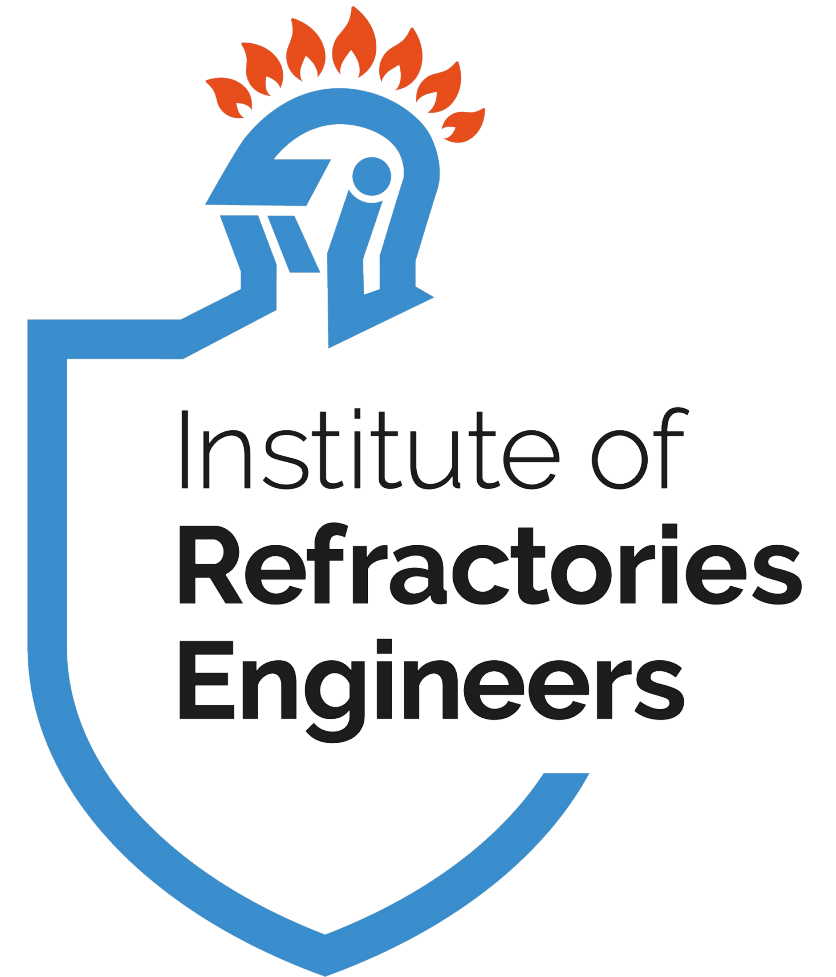
Fundamental Objectives cont.

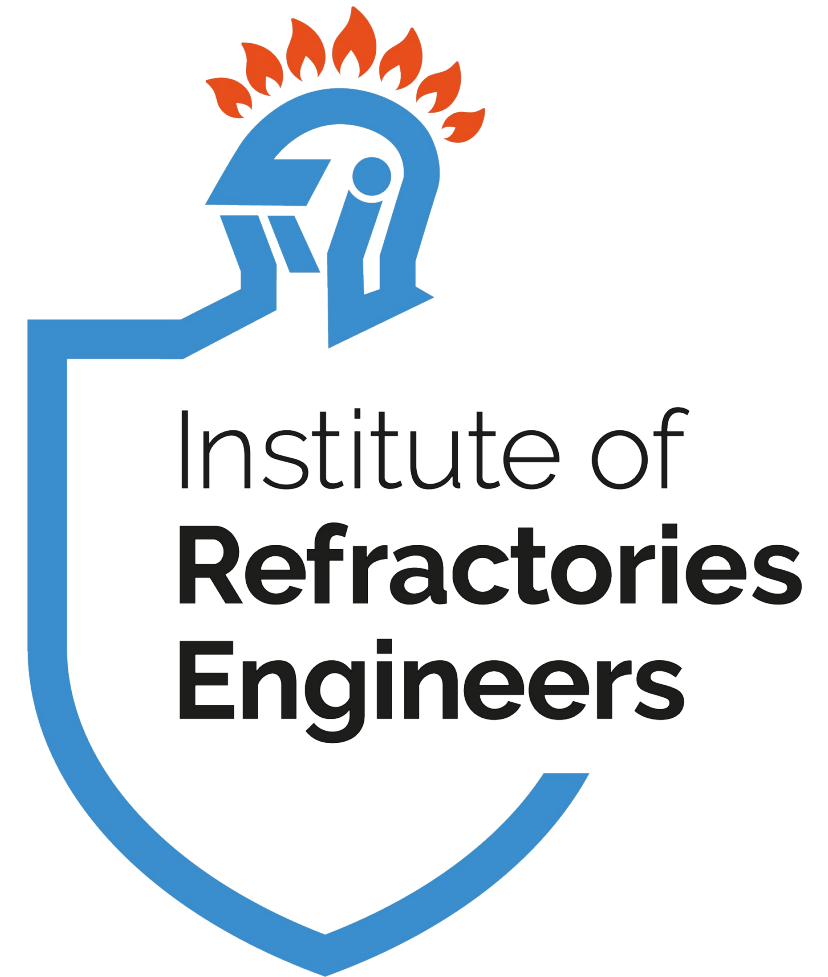
Fundamental Objectives cont.

We are always open to new suggestions on how to exchange information to benefit each other and ultimately the industry.

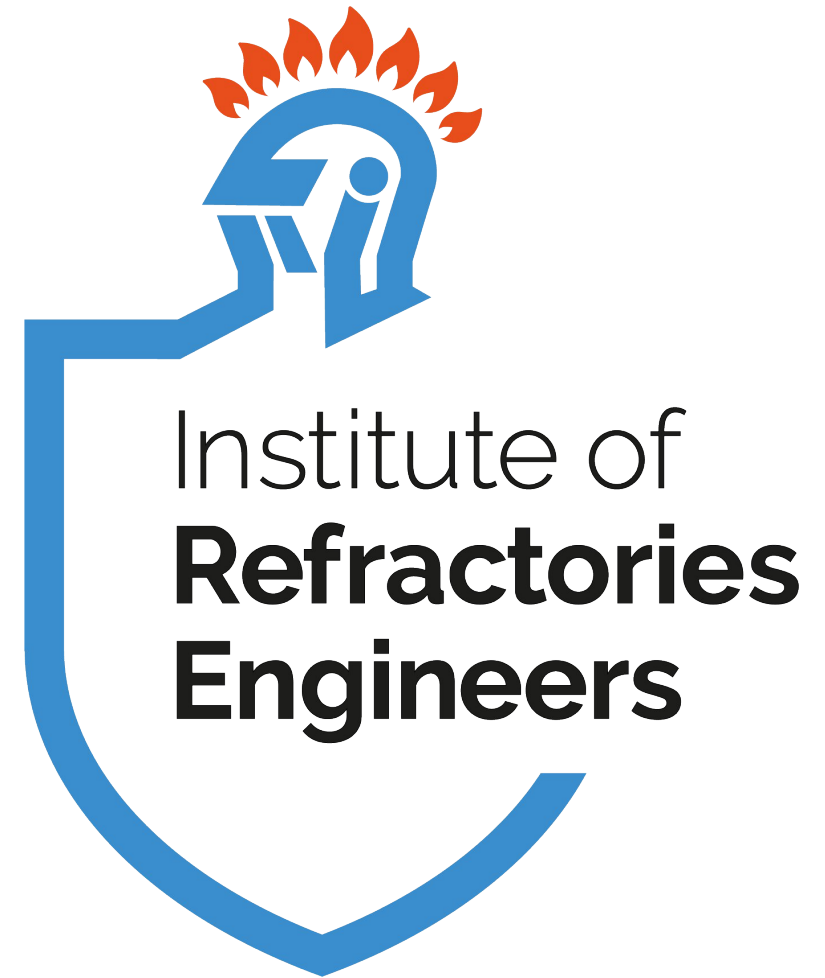


2026-2027

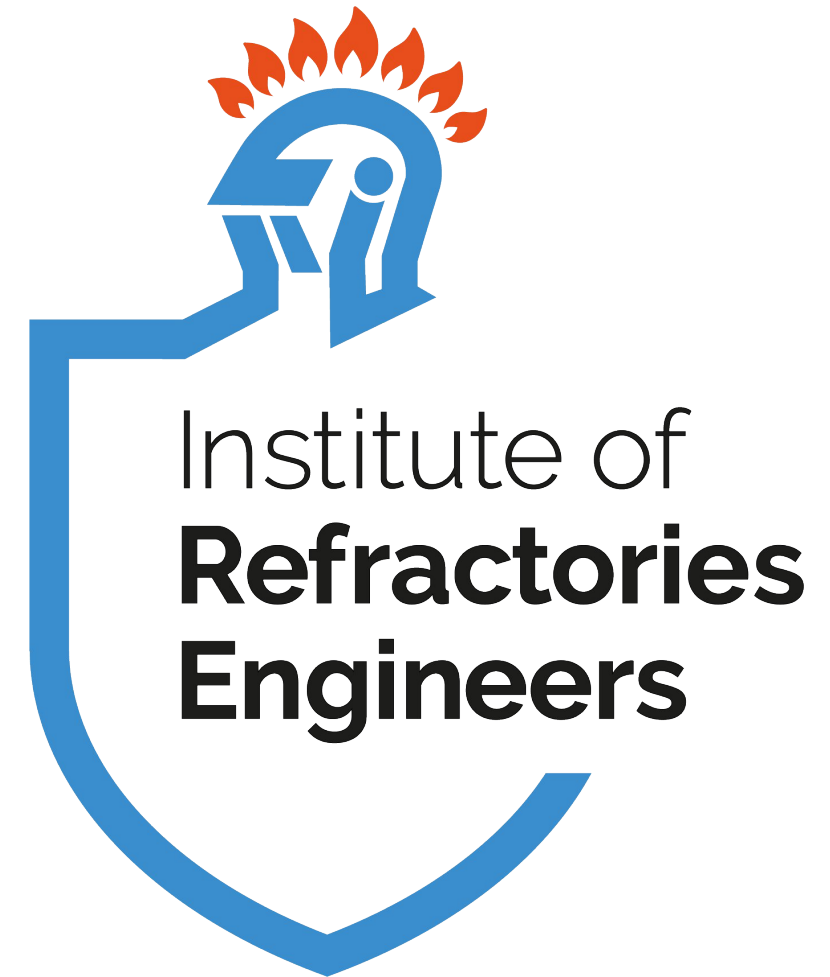

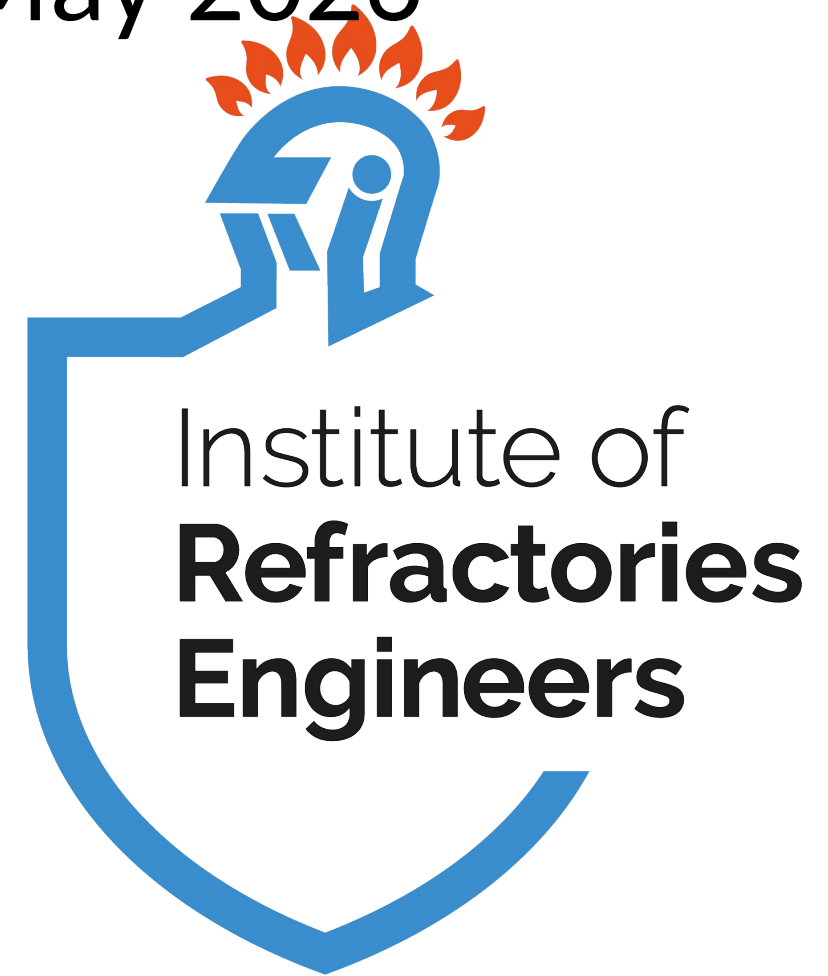


Balance Sheet Year to Date May 2026
